A LEGACY OF FEEDING OTHERS

In April of 2020, Oliver Hall had an idea. As the pandemic descended on the community, the need for food was rising. Oliver was a cook, so why not put that skill to use for those who need it? Cooking food and delivering it to those in need runs in the family - Oliver's father Herman once provided the same help to his friends and neighbors. In his honor "Herman's Place" was born.

Today, Herman's Place has provided more than 3,000 meals to hungry people across Douglas County, while also connecting them to other vital services. In 2022, Herman's Place received a UWKV Racial Equity Grant, allowing them to cover the rising price of food, and serve even more people. With this foundation, Oliver has his eyes set on expansion to continue his father's legacy of serving others.
